INSPIRE, a dance collective to shift the culture of dance in Milwaukee

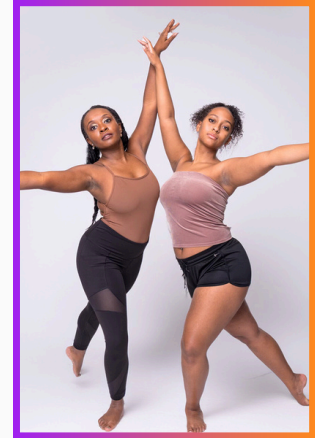
